

**Meredith College General Education Program
Alternate methods for completion of CORE 100
Application for Transfer Students**

The requirement for the CORE 100 course will be satisfied by any student who can demonstrate through her college transcript or other appropriate documentation that one course, courses in combination, or life experience explicitly address the following:

CORE 100 course goals:

- Broad knowledge of U.S. cultural diversity;
- Skills in textual analysis; critical thinking and critical reflection;
- Experience in collaborative problem solving and collaborative presentation.

Please mark which of the following options your are requesting (may be both):

1. _____ I took a course or courses in which I accomplished the CORE 100 course goals. (You may be able to use more than one course to meet all of these goals.)

2. _____ I participated in paid or volunteer experience in a setting inclusive of multiple cultural groups. This participation was continuous across a span of at least 60 workdays.

You must attach documentation showing that you have accomplished the goals of CORE 100. Acceptable documentation for option one would be a course description and transcript record of a “C” or better on courses applied to equivalency credit. You may also be asked to submit a course syllabus. Documentation for option two requires a job description of your paid or volunteer experience and a signed statement from a supervisor affirming that you participated continuously for at least 60 workdays. Other documentation might include copies of paycheck stubs and/or tax forms.

Once you have gathered the proper documentation, you may submit this form to the office of the Director of General Education for approval. If you have any questions regarding these guidelines and/or documentation please contact the office of the Director of General Education.
