Course Descriptions

Students may choose to apply for the orchestra that matches either their age or their playing level. Students who choose an orchestra level higher than their age group as listed below must send in a written recommendation from their teacher and schedule an orchestra level change audition. Auditions will be Friday May 1st starting at 3:00. If choosing to change orchestra level, call 760-2871 to schedule an audition time.

Mozart Music Makers Ages 6 – 10

This group is for newer, less experienced players as well as students who have studied for several years and have been in elementary level orchestras. More experienced players will help others in learning to follow the conductor. The students will acquire reading and ensemble skills and appropriate repertoire will be mastered.

Haydn Strings Ages 10 – 14

To **audition for a level change** to this orchestra, students should be strong readers and be Able to process complex bowings and rhythms. The General level of this group includes:
Key signatures: up to 3 flats and 3 sharps mandatory
Positions: 1st – 4th positions (all of the neck positions)
Reading level: Middle School Repertoire or Suzuki book four

Beethoven Chamber Orchestra Ages 14 – 18

Students should be very advanced on their instruments to **audition for a level change** to this group. The general level of this group includes:
Key signatures: all
Positions: 1st – 6th
Cellists must know tenor clef.
Reading: Advanced high school orchestral repertoire or Suzuki book six.

Courses For All Students: (depending on orchestra placement)

Sectionals

All campers will have one period per day devoted to sectionals. Each section will meet in small groups to work with a coach on different aspects of the orchestra music. This will have a more individualized approach to learning the music.

Components of Music

Students in the Mozart Music Makers will participate in this fun movement-oriented class as part of their camp experience. The objectives will emphasize basic aspects of rhythm training, music reading, pitch recognition, and performance skills.

Clinician Biographies

Dr. KIRK D. MOSS leads activities and string education as an Associate Professor of Music at Minnesota State University Moorhead. Under his baton, the University Symphony Orchestra has tripled in size and performed for the 2007 North Dakota M.E.A. Conference. He has appeared as a guest conductor, clinician, or adjudicator in over twenty states, including presenting sessions for The Midwest Clinic, M.E.N.C. National Conference, and A.S.T.A. National Conference.

The American String Teachers Association has presented him with three National Citation for Leadership & Merit awards. His service to A.S.T.A. includes an elected term on the National Executive Board, chair of the National Orchestra Festival, and president of the Georgia chapter. Currently, he chairs the Development Committee and serves on the Minnesota board.

Kirk has twelve years experience teaching elementary, middle, and high school orchestras. School orchestras under his direction earned recognition at state, national and international conferences and festivals. He also led the South Georgia String Project.

Moss holds a Ph.D. in Music Education, conducting emphasis, from the University of Florida (Gainesville); Master of Music, with a cognate in string pedagogy, from the Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music as a graduate teaching assistant from past A.S.T.A. president Gerald Doan; and Bachelor of Music, with high distinction, from the University of Michigan guided by past A.S.T.A. president Robert Culver.

Kirk and his wife, Deb, recently celebrated their twentieth anniversary. They have three children: Bethany, Luke, and Lydia.

Dr. JIM WADDELOW, a native of Oklahoma, joined the faculty of Meredith College as Director of Instrumental Activities in 2007. He conducts the Meredith Sinfonietta and serves as Musical Director for musical theatre productions in the Department of Dance and Theatre.

He has been the Orchestra Director of the Inspiration Point Fine Arts Colony Summer Camp in Eureka Springs, Arkansas since 1999. Jim is the Music Director and Conductor of Lubbock Moonlight Musicals in Lubbock, Texas. He has conducted over 25 operas and musicals at the college and professional level. Previous appointments and affiliations include: Texas Tech University, The Oklahoma Youth Symphony, The Lubbock Youth Symphony, Summer Overtures Theater, The University of Central Oklahoma, and the University of Arkansas. He also conducted the nationally recognized Putnam City North High School Orchestra for six years.

Principal teachers include Gary Lewis, Ralph Morris, Roger Strong and Lon Dehnert. Jim is a member of the Conductor's Guild, College Orchestra Director's Association, American String Teacher's Association, Music Educators National Conference and the College Music Society. He is an active clinician and adjudicator throughout the South. Dr. Waddelow holds the BME degree from the University of Central Oklahoma; MM University of Central Oklahoma; DMA Texas Tech University. He teaches courses such as: Orchestra, Conducting, Instrumentation, Orchestration Instrumental Music Education.

Theory and related Music Topics

Students in the Haydn Strings group will have a theory class each day in which they will learn a variety of different structural aspects of music. The theory workshops will cover many topics about music and is meant to be interesting, fun, and expand theoretical skills of the student who already has some experience in music.

Chamber Music for Advanced Players

All students in the Beethoven Chamber Orchestra who are not in the Honors Quartet Program will be in a chamber music group. One class period per day will be devoted to playing in a small group with a coach instead of a conductor. Emphasis will be on chamber music skills.

Honors Quartet Program

Honors Quartets are optional for students ages 14 – 18 and are **by audition only**. Auditions will take place May 2nd starting at 3:00. These groups are very advanced. They receive 2 ½ hours of coaching per day and their camp day is extended until 4:30. Chamber music specialists are hired to work with these students. Honors Quartets perform at the Thursday camp mini-concert with a possible repeat performance at 3:30 at the Whole Foods Market. There is an additional \$100.00 fee for this program. Auditions (See the “Deadlines and Information” section of this brochure for more details)

Teacher recommendations are required for all auditions. Students will be asked to play a scale of their choice, solo piece, sight-read a short excerpt and complete an interview.

Extended Day Swimming (indoor activities will be provided in the event of pool closure).

Students age 8 and above are eligible for the extended day swimming program for a fee of \$20.00 per week. Extended day is from 3:00 – 5:00, Monday through Thursday. All swimmers are required to pass a basic swimming test.

***Adult Pedagogy and Teacher CEU's**

The guest clinician will conduct an adult pedagogy session Monday through Thursday from 3:15 until 5:15. This course is recommended for area music education professionals and music education majors. Pedagogy participants also observe the clinicians at work during the day. College and CEU credit is available. The fee for CEU's and non-credit participants not teaching at the camp is \$50.00. College credit is through Meredith College and the fees are as listed in the college catalogue.

***Counselor Volunteer Program and Counselor in Training Program**

These programs are for high school seniors and rising seniors with preference given to students who have participated at LSMC as campers for several years.
