HOW TO APPLY FOR THE MEREDITH COLLEGE TEACHING FELLOWS PROGRAM

Step 1:

Apply for admission to Meredith College. Complete and submit a Meredith Freshman Admission application, along with your official high school transcript, official SAT or ACT scores, and a written recommendation from a teacher who taught you in an academic subject in 11th or 12th grade. Step 2:

Complete and submit a Meredith College Teaching Fellows application no later than January 15, 2016. You can apply online at www.meredith.edu/academics/teaching_fellows. Please be sure you have a family member, teacher, or mentor review your application materials.

Step 3:

Qualifying candidates for the Meredith College Teaching Fellows Program will be invited to interview during Scholars Weekend. Invitations to interview for the Teaching Fellows program are issued between January 15 and February 1 so that finalists may participate in Scholars Weekend held in February.

Recipients of the Teaching Fellows academic award will be notified by mail no later than March 31.
