IDS 288: Career Readiness for the Global Citizen 3 credits	This course will take you on a transformative journey of self-discovery and cultural exploration and is designed to enhance your career readiness in any profession. You will engage in a blend of interactive lectures, hands-on activities, and both guided and independent excursions that will help you to develop the essential skills, knowledge, and attitudes needed to thrive in today's globalized workforce based upon the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) career readiness competences. Through activities geared towards critical thinking, problem solving, flexibility, and resilience, you will gain invaluable insights that will set you apart as a culturally adept and adaptable professional prepared to excel in any field. ENG 949: Journey to Italy 3 credits	Italy has always been a special destination for travelers. Italy also lured all the major Romantic and Victorian poets. Many twentieth century English novelists also lived in Italy and produced masterpieces here. This class will explore texts and cultural contexts, personal and social conflicts, and techniques of literature written during Italian journeys.  Note: ENG 200 pre-requisite can be waived if students have yet to take it.	Literature Requirement
PED 148: Yoga 1 credit	This course provides a foundation for beginners. Students learn warm-up and breathing exercises, as well as basic Yoga asanas. Particular attention is given to exploring the internal support for external alignment and posture.	Health and Physical Learning Requirement
